Part 2: Description

Overview: This module provides an opportunity to receive guidance from tutors, marks the culmination of the PG Certificate Professional Practice and Management in Architecture award, and is required for successful completion of the 'Part 3 course'.

Features: Module Entry Requirements: students must have ARB/RIBA Part 1 and 2 in Architecture

Educational Aims: The aim of this module is to integrate the knowledge and skills acquired in other modules with experience gained in practice as preparation for the Part 3 examination.

Outline Syllabus: In order to achieve the specific learning outcomes of this module, students are expected to draw on and assimilate the topics delivered in the following co-requisite modules: Architectural Profession and Project Procedures, Procurement and Contract Management, Practice Management and Personal Development.

Teaching and Learning Methods: Tutorials: 10 hours

Self-Directed Learning: 290 hours

Module hours: 300 hours

Teaching and learning is largely self-directed learning methods, with guidance provided in tutorials, which develop the key themes professional experience and competence for practice. The knowledge and skills acquired in the other co-requisite modules and experience gained in practice augment the teaching and learning in this module.

Part 3: Assessment

The written assessment components in this module form part of the documentary submission, which is completed prior to the Oral Exam / Professional Interview. As part of this module, students are expected to bring together portfolio material produced from the other co-requisite modules on this programme. The portfolio forms part of the documentary submission, which includes the Record of Professional Experience, the CV and Career Evaluation and the Case Study.

The Oral Exam / Professional Interview is the final part of the Examination in Professional Practice and Management (Part 3). This will be conducted in part by a Professional Examiner retained from the list of professional examiners published by the RIBA, and in accordance with RIBA Part 3 Course Regulations.
