Part 2: Description
<p>Features: Module Entry Requirements: students must have successfully completed an undergraduate degree in architectural design.</p> <p>Educational Aims: See learning outcomes.</p> <p>Outline Syllabus: The aim of this module is to integrate the knowledge and skills acquired in other academic modules with experience gained in architectural practice and develop and demonstrate the reflexive capability and professional judgement needed to pass the ARB/RIBA Part 3 examination.</p> <p>Teaching and Learning Methods: The teaching and learning strategy is largely by self-directed learning methods, with guidance provided in tutorials, which develop the key themes of professional experience and competence for practice. The knowledge and skills acquired in the pre-requisite modules and experience gained in practice augment teaching and learning in this module.</p>

Part 3: Assessment			
<p>The student is required to develop a documentary submission demonstrating their professional experience, judgement and knowledge. The written assessment Elements in this module form part of this documentary submission. These Elements are the Professional Experience Development Record (A2), the CV and Career Evaluation (B1) and the Case Study (B2). These three documents are assessed by the Professional Examiner and the latter two documents are awarded a percentage grade.</p> <p>Students are also expected to bring together portfolio material produced from the other pre-requisite modules on this programme and include this in their documentary submission. This portfolio of material from the other prerequisite modules is not assessed as part of this module, but is provided to the Professional Examiner as supplementary evidence of the student's skill and professional knowledge.</p> <p>The Oral Exam/Professional Interview (A1) is conducted by a Professional Examiner retained from the list of Professional Examiners published by the RIBA, and in accordance with RIBA Part 3 Course Regulations. The Professional Examiner has previously reviewed the written assessment Elements A2, B1 and B2 and discussion of those documents becomes the substance of this Professional Interview. The oral Exam/Professional Interview (A1) is assessed as a Pass/Fail.</p>
