### Assessment strategy: Task 1 (60%) - LO 2 & 3

Task 1 is a 3000-word report critically evaluating an event from the perspective of one of the topics covered on the module (e.g. globalisation or a related concept; sustainability; or equality, diversity or inclusion).

Task 2: Viva (40%) - LO 1 & 3

Task 2 is an online oral examination/viva (40%). This involves learners drawing on theory to formulate evaluative responses to questions about the field of events supporting their argument with evidence and illustrative examples.
