Part 3: Assessment

This module deploys a mix of formative and summative assessment. Their aim is to evaluate the student's skill in understanding a range of business and economic concepts applicable to the individual, the firm and the economic environment (nationally and globally).

Formative assessment takes various forms and will occur throughout the module – in lectures and workshops and, will include regular online tests, peer and tutor feedback on workshop activities. The first summative assessment opportunity occurs with a 2,000 word essay. This will occur in the middle of the module run. The exam will occur at the end of the module.

Summative Assessment

Component A:

An end-of-module exam (2 hours) using essay or data response questions in various formats.

Component B: 1500 words (excl references)

1500 word essay on an issue relevant to international businesses, and their managerial response to changes in economic environment.

Formative Assessment:

- Throughout the module, online tests will provide formative assessment

- Engagement with other students in seminars and lectures which also encourages cohort identity a sense of belonging.

- Regular VLE messages, to provide generic feedback to groups on lectures, workshop activities and summative assessments.
