can apply knowledge and understanding from the whole programme to the work environment.

**Outline syllabus:** The theories, models and concepts used in the project will be drawn largely from the four preceding modules supported by guidance on research methodologies and the writing and structuring of a research project.

Indicative topics that will be covered include:

Identifying and presenting a proposal for a research project

Conducting a literature review

An outline of methodological approaches

Using qualitative data in research

Using quantitative data in research

Analysing and presenting data

Drawing conclusions and justifying recommendations

### **Part 3: Teaching and learning methods**

**Teaching and learning methods:** On completion of the programme modules, students will be allocated a research project supervisor. Students will be required to submit a research project proposal to their supervisor, demonstrating applied knowledge and understanding of research methodology, prior to undertaking the substantive part of their research project research.

Students will be required to develop a schedule with their supervisor and to liaise, normally by e-mail, as the project develops and progresses.

The topic chosen should be relevant to management business administration and should demonstrate application of module concepts and theories covered in the programme modules.

Students will be expected to present the completed work in formal research project style and to submit a reference list and, if appropriate, a bibliography of sources, using the designated referencing conventions.
