Part 3: Assessment

A1: FET Library Online Workbook to introduce and develop research and referencing skills during the first teaching block; This element reflects this module's integration of a library familiarisation exercise, designed to assist the first-year students with their research skills.

A2: an examination with short-answer questions and seen essay questions. This element is the primary means of assessment for the "Development" context of the module, 1 of 3. The essay questions are made available to the students in advance, to assist with incrementally developing their essay-writing skills, whilst the short-answer questions will be unseen (but on topics covered).

B1: 1,500-word report; this element is the primary means of assessment for the "Planning" context of the module. It is designed to assist students with developing a range of academic skills, such as research and writing style, whilst also allowing them to demonstrate attainment of the relevant learning objectives.

B2: an exam. This element is the primary means of assessment for the "Legal" context of the module. It is designed to assist students in making connections between the various legal topics explored, to ensure the relevant learning objectives are appropriately assessed.
