Part 4: Assessment

Assessment strategy: Component A: Written Assessment (50% of module mark) 2,000 word piece of coursework to assess the student's knowledge and understanding of the basic concepts and principles of public international law.

Component B: Written Assessment (50% of module mark)

2,000 word piece of coursework that enables students to focus on a specific legal regime (see themes) and develop a more in-depth understanding of the law. Students can demonstrate their analytical and critical skills, engage with a wider range of arguments and discuss the law in its wider social, economic and political context.
