Teaching and Learning Methods: The teaching and learning associated with this module is based around a series of lectures and tutor-directed seminars. The study time associated with the module will be spent on a variety of different tasks and activities.

Scheduled learning includes lectures and tutor-directed seminars.

Independent learning includes hours engaged with essential reading, directed learning, assignment preparation and completion.

On average, there will be three hours of contact per week for each student, in the form of lectures and tutor-directed seminars. The emphasis throughout the module will be on student-led activities.

Part 3: Assessment

The assessment for this module is made up of two components.

Component A

Component A comprises an examination.

Expectations concerning the report will be clearly set out and will reinforce advice and guidance provided through earlier years. There will be an opportunity for feedback on draft reports through semester one.
