Part 3: Assessment

During this module students have to obtain a work placement. (A list of inviting Interior Design firms or Interior Design practitioners will be supplied. Selection will be discussed and negotiated with tutors).

Assessment will be based 100% on Component A:

A report (formats for reports will be negotiated as part of a learning contract and the content will relate to the type of industry liaison undertaken) which will be either on:

Work placement of 8 weeks with a log-book report of work undertaken.

Shadowing of a practitioner for 8 weeks with log-book report of work practices observed.

A step by step documentation should be reported. All of the reports will involve the demonstration of understanding of a selected 6 of the 13 RIBA Stages of Work.

Outcomes for each type of report must be supported with relevant contractual documentation and the Work Placement report additionally requires a practice-liaison form filled in by yourself and the practitioner. In addition, a daily research time-sheet will be required from all you. All reports will be discussed in class. Each student must give copies of his/her report to all other students.

Assessment Criteria:

Awareness of selected interior design practice.

Clear and precise communication.

Log-book (A4 OR A5) and a report of work undertaken.
