Part 2: Description

Overview: This module concentrates on the role of Contracts Administrator as performed under JCT contracts and explores how the obligations of various parties are defined and interpreted especially when subject to legal precedent established in case law.

Various forms of contract are acknowledged as are the reasons behind the selection of specific procurement routes that require them.

Part 3: Assessment

Exam to be 2 hours in duration with 3 questions to be attempted from a bank of 5 seen questions. 1 of the 5 question to be compulsory the other 2 to students choice.
