#### Part 2: Description

This module is based around a range of pivotal US foreign policy case studies from 1945-present. The module is designed to go inside the minds of US policymakers to understand why the US has pursued certain foreign policy packages at certain times, and in certain cases. As the world's only current 'superpower' the module seeks to chart the rationale for America's definition of its national interests as being global, and the various foreign policies that are made as a result. This is done largely through the analysis and discussion of primary sources (e.g. public policy papers, declassified archival papers and speeches) and a complementary reading of secondary sources to put the primary sources into context.

As the content deals with real world cases each week, including some of the most pivotal wars and crises in recent memory, it is very much a practical module that goes beyond simply understanding politics towards instilling a professional appreciation of how politics is done at many levels of government. This equips students with many real-world transferrable skills such as policy analysis, report writing and presenting and understanding government and governing. In other words, to borrow a well-known political analogy, it shows 'how the sausage is made' so that students can forge their own policy making insights and skills and then take those beyond their degree.
