Part 2: Description

Overview: This module will introduce students to socio-political debates in education. It will consider how social policy is developed and the impact of this on different groups in society. Students will reflect on the ways in which formal and informal education can impact on the life chances for learners.

Educational aims: This module will support students to understand some of the contemporary socio-political debates and the impact of social policy on different groups in society.

It will enable them to consider the impact of social policy and inclusive practice on life chances for learners.

Outline syllabus: Reflection on key theories, readings and debates relating to social justice and inclusion

The development of social policy

The impact of education and social policy upon different groups in society.

The ways in which formal and informal education can impact upon social, cultural and political capital for learners and communities.

Part 3: Teaching and learning methods

Teaching and learning methods: Scheduled learning may include lectures, seminars, tutorials, supervision, demonstration, practical classes and workshops.

Independent learning includes hours engaged with essential reading, study preparation, peer study and assignments.

Work based learning: students are expected to be in the workplace throughout this module thus able to draw on work based experiences to complete their assessments.

Part 4: Assessment

Assessment strategy: The presentation will give students opportunity to embed their theoretical understanding and present initial ideas for their second piece of work. The presentation will be 8 minutes with 2 minutes for questioning.

Students can learn from each other through peer review.

The written assignment (3000 words) will enable students to engage with the module content within their own professional context, developing ideas from the initial presentation.

Formative assessment opportunities will be given to students throughout the module.

This will be supported by activities within seminars. These assessments will help students to build on feedback and mitigate the use of AI.
