### Part 2: Description

Reflecting that enquiry and exploration are at the heart of the Future Nurse curriculum so that as nurses of the future students are able to influence and contribute to processes of organisational change through an awareness of local and national policies

• This module focuses on global health challenges drawing on the experiences of students who have undertaken international placements or experiences.

This module will use a range of learning and teaching strategies to support student learning and will include:

- Lectures
- Scenario based teaching through interaction and simulation
- Group work
- Self-directed learning
- Digital learning delivered through Blackboard and other virtual learning platforms

#### Part 3: Assessment: Strategy and Details

The assessment strategy for this module is designed to allow a diverse range of students to be able to explore their own current and future practice focusing on an existing and or emerging model of care.

The assessment is a 2,000 word essay that evaluates the personal learning plan

The aim of this assignment is for students to develop self-directed study skills and an ability to choose their own topics for investigation. To achieve this they will produce a personal learning plan that relates to the learning outcomes. Students will be encouraged to use their international experiences from elective and Erasmus placements in considering a topic of their choice. The students are expected to present their plan to the group to widen their perspectives on the topic as the Formative assessment strategy.
