Overview: This module will explore relevant research and how it can be conducted ethically and responsibly. The impact of Research will be discussed. Students will undertake a small scale study.

To give students oportunity to expore an area of interest that will support their future employability.

Outline syllabus: Students will develop their knowledge and understanding of research skills.

They will carry out a small scale research project based around an area of professional development.

Students will be encouraged to work independently and collaboratively with others in the workplace to support the final project

Part 3: Teaching and learning methods

Teaching and learning methods: Scheduled learning may include lectures, seminars, tutorials, supervision, demonstration, practical classes and workshops.

Independent learning includes hours engaged with essential reading, study preparation, peer study and assignments.

Part 4: Assessment

Assessment strategy: Students will consolidate knowledge and understanding of research skills.

They will work independently and in collaboration with others in their workplace to complete a research project based on an area of professional development.

Students will present for 8 minutes with a further 2 minutes of questioning with their initial research ideas.

The second task will be a written account of an investigation (3500 words) on an area of interest to the student which will serve to further their professional development and feed into future employability skills.

Formative assessment opportunities will be given to students throughout the module. This will be supported by activities within seminars.
