## Part 2: Description

This choice module is of interest to students who may be considering a career in a community or primary care setting. It will build on community practice experience to add depth of knowledge and understanding in key areas applied to community nursing; for example the differing cultures of community nursing and primary care nursing, implications of autonomous working, and working with people with long term conditions to improve self-management. Students will have the opportunity to practise a range of skills in both simulated clinic and home settings.

A variety of teaching approaches may be used, including face to face, practical sessions, technology enhanced learning. Online learning resources will provide students with information and the use of scenarios enables the student to critically explore real situations in both community and primary care. Support will be available from facilitating lecturers and student peers during this module.

The course content will include

- community health policies and local protocols
- consultation skills
- team working with / in general practice
- clinical skills such as holistic wound assessment, phlebotomy, Doppler and Multilayer bandaging.

## Part 3: Assessment: Strategy and Details

This module is summatively assessed through a 2,000 word assignment to evaluate the evidence in relation to provision of person-centred care in the community context. Exact title to be confirmed in the module handbook.

The assignment will enable students some flexibility to reflect their own interest and learning, but

guidelines will signpost what should be included in order to demonstrate achievement of the module learning outcomes.

The assignment will be explained at the beginning of the module, when those who may need increased support for the assignment via the study skills team / library resources, will be asked to identify themselves by emailing the module leader. There will be a further assignment session at the end of the module. The submission is planned to enable students a sufficient period of preparation.
