Part 2: Description

Features: Module Requirements Students must have 60 credits at level 1

Educational Aims: The module provides a variety of employability-related learning activities. The aim of the module is to allow students to identify existing skills and skills gaps, enabling them to become more self-aware and confident as the year progresses in order that they increase their success in securing their preferred career pathway. The module develops a range of professional skills to equip students with knowledge and experience of extending their personal and professional competences using the following thematic approach.

Outline Syllabus: The syllabus includes:

Enhancing your employability (i): beginning the process of professionalising by assessing current strengths and weaknesses in relation to personal and academic growth. Developing practical skills related to employability.

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Enhancing your employability (ii): contexts for volunteering, placements and internships, assessment centres. Lifelong learning and professional development planning.

Professional showcases: each showcase will relate to key geographical and environmental career sectors and postgraduate study. Each showcase will include analyses of trends and key influencing policies within each sector and, where possible, presentations from recent alumni now employed within that sector or undertaking postgraduate study.

Applied skills for the professional environmental manager: geographic information systems

Teaching and Learning Methods: Scheduled learning will include keynote lectures and supervised time in workshops and practicals. The focus will be on students becoming reflective practitioners as professional development skills are explored, developed and practised. The process of students "professionalising themselves" during the module will be at the heart of learning and teaching experience.

The module actively supports the development of skills and experiences that students may evidence for the UWE Futures Award. There will be opportunities for engagement with both Faculty and University "Employers Fair" exhibitions and occasional lectures from local employers and alumni.

Access to careers resources (facilitated by the UWE Careers team) will provide further opportunities for independent working on key employabilityrelated skills such as CV writing, job application strategies and interview techniques.

Independent learning will include regular engagement with essential reading, the development of professional and reflective skills, networking experiences in and out of the University to support the development of evidence for the summative portfolio.

Contact Hours:

Students will receive – on average – 3 hours of contact per week. Contact will be in the form of lectures, workshops or practical sessions, depending on the topic studied.

Part 3: Assessment

Summative assessment:

The module is assessed through an individual viva voce examination and the submission of an individual portfolio of evidence.

Component A – individual viva voce examination:

Duration: 15 minutes

Delivered within a professional job interview-style context

The viva will be assessed according to the following criteria:

Reflection on personal and academic development

Competencies: evidencing skills and / or experiences

Response to competency-based questions

Confidence and demeanour

Component B - individual portfolio:

Collection of evidence of activities relating to professional development and lifelong learning Equivalent to 2,500 words

Portfolios will be assessed according to the following criteria:

Evidence of employment and professional networking activities

Evidence of the development of professional and lifelong learningrelated skills

Depth of reflection upon employment and networking activities

Depth of analysis of employment and lifelong learning-related skills

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Standards of literacy and presentation

Formative assessment:

Opportunities for formative feedback are embedded throughout the module, particularly during interactive workshops and practical sessions.
