Part 3: Teaching and learning methods

Teaching and learning methods: This module is only available to students of interior architecture at UWE who are spending one year abroad on Erasmus exchange.

Students will follow a suite of modules on offer at the host university to enable them to achieve the module learning outcomes (See Learning Outcomes). Partner universities have been carefully chosen so as to be able to offer the required learning and the required credits. The modules followed abroad must be approved by UWE staff in advance of the exchange taking place.

Once abroad students study in the surroundings of the host university and are tutored by staff of that institution. Staff at UWE are also available (via internet etc...) for support.

Assessment arrangements are explained below.

Scheduled learning includes studio, lectures, tutorials, workshop, site visits.

student work and issue a mark. This mark will be communicated to UWE and, along

with the portfolio and viva voce exam (based on the portfolio) will inform UWE staff of

a mark and credit to be awarded.

All work is individual, there is no group work.

Re-sit work will require students to rework the portfolio and have another viva voce

examination.
