## Part 2: Description

In this module the history and contemporary organisation of social policy and the legal system, primarily with reference to England and the UK will be considered. This includes philosophy, key principles and the relationship between the law, social policy and social work practice with children, young people and adults.

Central concepts and theoretical perspectives in relation to social policy and law including application to citizenship responsibility, choice and rights; human rights and social justice; discrimination and equalities; poverty and other forms of social disadvantage; voluntary, statutory, private and informal sector provision; advocacy, service user involvement and personalisation; and the nature of legal authority and statutory accountability will be explored.

This includes contemporary legal and policy developments in relation to welfare, health care, social care, criminal justice, housing, education, immigration/asylum and other fields of relevance to social work practice, management of risk, dilemmas and debates in social work in health and social care related fields of practice.

## Part 3: Assessment

This module is assessed through a summative written assignment, and a timed examination. The combination of approaches is intended to comprehensively assess a range of capabilities of the student, in terms of critical evaluation; recall and application of practice related knowledge
