<p><b>Features:</b> Module Entry Requirements: NMC Registered Nurse and/or Midwife, plus support from a prescriber in practice</p> <p><b>Educational Aims:</b> See Learning Outcomes.</p> <p><b>Outline Syllabus:</b> The syllabus for the teaching reflects current NMC requirements to register as a community practitioner nurse prescriber and will include:</p> <p>Consultation, decision-making and therapy, including referral.</p> <p>Influences on, and psychology of, prescribing.</p> <p>Prescribing in a team context; clinical pharmacology, including the effects of co-morbidity.</p> <p>Evidence-based practice and clinical governance in relation to nurse prescribing; Legal, policy and ethical aspects.</p> <p>Professional accountability and responsibility and Prescribing in the public health context.</p>

## STUDENT AND ACADEMIC SERVICES

**Teaching and Learning Methods:** Placement learning: Learning in practice will comprise a minimum of 65 hours.

Scheduled learning: (approx. 40 hours) includes lectures, seminars, workshops and tutorials.

Independent learning: (approx. 95 hours) includes hours engaged with essential reading, exam preparation, portfolio completion, assignment preparation and completion etc.

200 hours, which includes both scheduled learning and placement learning.

### Part 3: Assessment

There are two components of assessment:

**Component A:**

Assessment of Professional Competencies by an approved qualified practitioner using the single competency framework for all prescribers (NPC, 2012), which meets the NMC Standards.

**Component B:**

The Prescribing portfolio provides all the evidence required to demonstrate that students have achieved the required standard in all of the elements required by the NMC to register as a community prescriber.

The portfolio is required to contain all of the following:

A statement from your registered prescribing supervisor confirming your attendance, the achievement of practice competencies and a final report. You must include your learning contract and action plans.

A certificate confirming that a Numeracy Test, set and marked by a member of the academic has been passed at 100%. Evidence of the minimum 80% pass mark for the Pharmacology MCQ and Short Answer Question exam. The written examination will consist of a total of twenty, short answer and multi-choice questions (MCQ) to test pharmacological knowledge and its application to practice. This is a 1 and a half hour unseen examination.

A presentation to demonstrate safe and appropriate prescribing decisions. This must include one accurately written prescription demonstrating calculations and a reference list. More information will be given during the face to face sessions.

Directed Learning Activities assessed by the Prescribing mentor in practice completed throughout the programme.

Both Components A and B have a formative aspect of assessment as students will be able to gain ongoing feedback from Practice Teachers/Mentors during their practice placement and they will be able to obtain formative feedback on other aspects of their prescribing portfolio from Academic staff.

Please note it is a requirement from the NMC that if a student answers a question wrongly or omits something which could result in direct harm to a patient they must be referred e.g. failure to ask about medication history, allergies, any over the counter medication, or incorrect dosage etc.
