Part 2: Description

The confidence and ability to think critically, apply knowledge and skills, and provide expert, evidence-based, nursing care lies at the centre of nursing practice, this module is one of a suite of choice modules that have been development to offer nursing students in their final year of their studies choice so that are empowered to consider long term career pathways prior to registration. Each of the choice module has been aligned to existing and emerging models of care. Reflecting that enquiry and exploration are at the heart of the Future Nurse curriculum so that as nurses of the future students are able to influence and contribute to processes of organisational change through an awareness of local and national policies

- This module focuses on Respiratory diseases as these affect 1 in 5 people and is the third biggest cause of death in the UK.
- The syllabus of the module will focus a range of respiratory diseases, with an in-depth focus on chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) and asthma

This module will use a range of learning and teaching strategies to support student learning and will include:

- Lectures
- Scenario based teaching through interaction and simulation
- Group work
- Self-directed learning
- Digital learning delivered through Blackboard and other virtual learning platforms.

Part 3: Assessment: Strategy and Details

The assessment strategy for this module is designed to allow a diverse range of students to be able to explore their own current and future practice focusing on an existing and or emerging model of care.

Formative Assessment

Students to register and complete the online training on Assessment of Core Knowledge and Practice Skills. Facilitates the role of a stop smoking practitioner in England.

Summative Assessment

Assignment on effectiveness of treatment: Writing an essay demonstrating knowledge and understanding of a specific area of treatment/intervention to a person living with a respiratory disease (2000 words).

The essay should include the pathophysiology of a respiratory disease and how effective the treatment/intervention is in order to meet the person's healthcare needs. The essay should clearly demonstrate understanding of the role of the practitioners in enhancing future practice.

At level M students are expected to critically evaluate, synthesise and provide independent perspectives regarding the delivery of treatment/intervention and management. This should include a critical exploration of literature and debate the wider socio-political implications of respiratory diseases.
