Part 2: Description

Educational Aims: This module will introduce students to a range of music theory concepts enabling them to:

Demonstrate an understanding of theory that underpins written musical language.

Demonstrate an understanding of practical applications of music theory with a variety of musical genres.

Demonstrate understanding of the key principles and terminology related to the analysis and composition of music.

Analyse pieces of music from a number of different musical periods.

The module will enable students to develop their understanding of music theory under the broad concepts of Pitch, Timbre and Time.

Outline Syllabus: Students will explore concepts including, but not limited to basic notation, harmony, key, voice leading, transposition, modulation, structure and rhythm.

STUDENT AND ACADEMIC SERVICES

Teaching and Learning Methods: A mix of lectures, seminars, practical tutorials, short group projects and student-centered learning, designed to suit both current learning approaches and a wider range of modes of attendance and distance learning.

Tutorials will be orientated to hands-on exercises or seminars appropriate to different parts of the course but students will also be required to develop a reflective approach by discussing criteria for the evaluation of music and sound and applying those criteria to practical exercises that will include an element of reflection upon issues raised within the general lectures and personal experience. Working towards the key aims and objectives of this module may involve work outside university core hours.

Part 3: Assessment

Summative assessment will take the form of submission of a small portfolio of work and an in-class presentation of an analysis of a piece of music of the student's own choosing.

Throughout the course of the module formative assessment will take place in lectures, seminars and tutorials and will focus on the practical application of music theory through composition. There will be opportunities for formative learning in groups through peer assessment and through tutor feedback prior to summative assessment taking place.

Portfolio: to include a Multiple Choice Assignment on basic issues surrounding Music Theory and practical exercises related to Music Theory in Practice.

An in-class presentation (maximum length 10 minutes) of an analysis of a short piece of music (or single excerpt) of the student's own choosing with follow-up questions from the teaching team.
