Overview: This module explores Bristol's thriving and distinctive the film and television industries. It will consider their historical development and contemporary composition – their size, location and two major specialisms: animation and natural history filmmaking. It will analyse their importance to Bristol's cultural and economic life, and their relationship to the city's sustainability credentials.

Educational aims: The module aims to give students a critical understanding of Bristol's film and television cluster, and to enable them to develop an independent research project.

Outline syllabus: Students will research and critically examine the wide range of companies that comprise Bristol's film and television 'cluster', and situate them within their wider economic, socio-political and policy contexts. This will provide a detailed, critical and extremely current understanding of how one of the UK's major regional hubs is shaped by contemporary industry trends.
