Educational aims: This module explores ideas, thought and myths in their historical and contemporary contexts. It introduce students to key theoretical approaches to the analysis of texts and cultural productions.

Outline syllabus: Teaching sessions will introduce students to a range of thinking about Arts and Humanities through time. Lectures, workshops and seminars explore:

A history of key ideas relevant to study in the Arts and Humanities, from the Classical to the contemporary

Key debates in the Arts and Humanities, and how the Arts and Humanities have been understood over time

The relationships between the Arts and Humanities, the Sciences and the interdisciplinary 'spaces' between these disciplinary traditions.
