Overview: This module will support students to carry out a minimum of 30 hours work-based, community or civic learning activities informed by the knowledge of Politics and International Relations.

Part 4: Assessment

Assessment strategy: The portfolio assessment involves the completion of a number of subject-specific and professional development tasks as indicated in the module handbook and as planned through supervision and synchronous activities; this approach allows the student to use their work-based learning activities to contribute to their learning and assessment in an effective way. There will be opportunities through workshops and supervision for students to receive formative feedback which they can use to inform their summative work. To enable students to evidence learning outcomes and help them engage with real world issues, their portfolio activities will typically include a diverse range of approaches appropriate to the work-based learning activities both inside and outside of scheduled module time, such as a critical reflection, career development plans, leadership activities, briefs and presentations. Activities associated with the portfolio will involve around 3,500 words.
