Part 2: Description

This module is designed to give students the opportunity to undertake a short brief in preparation for a major 60 credit module of self-directed study.

In responding to the brief, students are required to focus on the relationship of their design interests and creative strengths to individual career aspirations.

The emphasis of the module is upon the further development and evaluation of a personal design methodology and the contextualisation of their practice within the Fashion and or Textile Industries.

At this level, students are expected to demonstrate competence in the use and application of appropriate processes and techniques in the development and realisation of their ideas. During this module they have the opportunity to further refine these skills and develop technical expertise through the development and testing of prototypes / samples.

For assessment, students are required to present their Learning Agreement, developmental work, supporting materials and research. This, along with a critical evaluation enable the student to further analyse their creative strengths and ambitions, and to use this process to begin to identify a programme of work for the subsequent 60 credit module, Extended Study in Fashion which aims to showcase their strengths and professional ambitions in Fashion Practice
