Assessment strategy: The Assessment:

Presentation (interim reflection) - offers the potential for interim reflection and requires students to outline their motivation for studying internationally and how the

experience responds to the professional goals they have set themselves. The

brief analysis concerning the city's geography, history and culture. This will be captured through an individual presentation that will need to be submitted in the

middle of the module.
