Part 2: Description

The confidence and ability to think critically, apply knowledge and skills, and provide expert, evidence-based, nursing care lies at the centre of nursing practice, this module is one of a suite of choice modules that have been developed to offer nursing students in their final year of their studies choice so that they are empowered to consider long term career pathways prior to registration. This module focuses urgent, emergency care same day emergency care (also known as ambulatory emergency care).
