Part 2: Description

Overview: This module will assess student's ability to perform at the level of a graduate Physician Associate.

It will cover the refinement of person-centred consultation skills including the development of a management plan.

This will include history gathering, clinical examination, person-centred

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communication skills and clinical reasoning as well as ensuring the level of selfawareness and reflection appropriate for professional practice.

Educational aims: This module provides learning on professional issues in physician associate practice in medical and surgical specialties

Outline syllabus: The module will cover:

History gathering, person-centred communication and consultation skills Physical examination skills Procedural skills and diagnostics Mental state assessment Application of clinical reasoning in the interpretation of clinical findings Recognition of emergency clinical situations Professional development The PA role and how to develop strategies to ask for help Working effectively in a multi-disciplinary team Personal responsibility and recognition of professional codes of conduct

Foundations in Physician Associate Practice 1 will focus on the application of the above to general adult medicine. Foundations in Physician Associate Practice 2 will focus on the application of the above to paediatrics, obstetrics and gynaecology, mental health, general surgery, emergency and acute medicine.

Part 3: Teaching and learning methods

Teaching and learning methods: Scheduled learning is largely skills based practical sessions, it includes lectures, seminars, tutorials, demonstration, simulation, practical classes.

Independent learning includes hours engaged with essential reading, case study preparation, assessment and placement preparation.
