Educational aims: This choice module is of interest to students who may be considering a career in a community or primary care setting. It will build on community practice experience to add depth of knowledge and understanding in key areas applied to community nursing; for example the differing cultures of community

nursing and primary care nursing, implications of autonomous working, and working with people with long term conditions to improve self-management. Students will have the opportunity to practise a range of skills in both simulated clinic and home settings.
