### Part 4: Assessment

**Assessment strategy:** The assessment strategy is designed to support and enhance the development of core subject specific skills and transferrable study skills with an emphasis on research skills. Assessment is through coursework.

The Practical Skills Assessment enables students to demonstrate their understanding of the basic requirements for academic writing. The editing task will require students to correctly reference a piece of writing and compile a bibliography in the correct format. This exercise will also encourage students to develop their drafting and editing skills including in relation to structure, presentation and writing in an appropriate academic register. This is intended to ensure students have a secure grasp of the conventions of academic writing.

The Written Assignment will enable students to demonstrate their ability to apply their understanding of the conventions of academic writing to their own work. Students will have a range of options related to their chosen degree programmes and will be required to undertake independent research and reading to produce a piece of academic writing. This task is also designed to support student progression onto their chosen degree programme.
