Part 2: Description

This module provides the opportunity for participants to select learning and development activities that are necessary for their personal role at UWE. Through workshops and mentoring discussions they will identify key areas for development and appropriate informal or formal activities to address these. Such activities might include online or face-to-face training events offered across the University, professional conversations with experienced colleagues and shadowing or observation opportunities. A learning journal will enable them to reflect on, learn and progress from their experiences.

The module runs for the entire length of the PGCAPP programme and, as such, provides an opportunity for participants to gain relevant support and development prior to the start of the timetabled activities in the first credit-bearing module. The evidence gathered throughout the module, along with the participant's achievement in the credit-bearing modules, will provide the basis for considering them ready for the End Point Assessment. Participants will be assessed externally if studying as part of an apprenticeship, or internally if not.

At the end of the module, the participants will be able to articulate an holistic approach to their academic practice integrating, where appropriate, teaching, research and professional practice. They will be prepared for their future professional lives as academics and able to consider and plan for their continuing professional development.

Part 3: Assessment: Strategy and Details

Strategy:

The summative assessment comprises three elements:

- A teaching observation
- A professional conversation

A written essay.

For participants engaged with the Academic Professional Apprenticeship this assessment will be delivered and assessed by an external provider. All other participants will be assessed through an equivalent internal process.

These summative assessments will build on formatively assessed evidence gathered throughout the module, including a reflective learning journal, UKPSF record of engagement and a CPD reflection / plan. This evidence will enable participants to record, reflect on and learn from their various development opportunities, and to plan for their future personal and professional development in the context of their discipline, their Department, the University and the wider HE sector.
