Educational Aims: See Learning Outcomes

Outline Syllabus: With the complex and multi-faceted nature of events, project management is an essential practical and theoretical area that relates directly to industry. This module introduces students to the emerging academic discipline of project management and how it can be utilised in events practice.

This module will cover:

Strategy (including procurement, collaboration and partnering, and stakeholder management). Project definition (including costing, risk assessment, and project scheduling). Implementation (including workflow, evaluation and service quality).

Part 3: Assessment

Component A is an individual presentation (10 mins) introducing a specific piece of project management theory that has been applied to an event case study that will have been covered in the evaluation in Component B. Presentations will take place during contact hours during the semester.

Component B is an individual evaluation of a project (2,500 words). The individual coursework component requires

research, evaluation and academic critical appraisal of a real life event project case study. Students will research a significant project from written articles and papers and critically analyse the project.
