Part 2: Description

In this module, you will explore the character of the conversation that poetry can have with the world, and how the form and performance of creative work engages its audience, whether through (for example) poetry in the built environment, open mic community events or more conventional poetry outputs. This module asks you, in particular, to consider how poetry can come off the page and into the lives of non-poetry readers. The focus is on the role that poetry can play in a diverse, inclusive society, and this module seeks to build bridges between classroom, city and community. As well as examining the work of others, you will create your own poetry in response to briefs that require an outward-looking attitude, seeking imaginative ways to reach specified audiences that may vary in age, geographic location, and/or activity-related identities (e.g. in a workplace).

You are required to submit a portfolio of work that includes the outcomes of tasks set during the module. These tasks are designed to enable you to demonstrate, for the purposes of assessment, the acquisition of skills, knowledge, understanding and/or experience that meets the learning outcomes for the module.

Assessment by portfolio is especially suitable in this Creative & Professional Writing programme, since it facilitates the curation of a selection of outputs demonstrating a range of ways in which the learning outcomes

have been met, typically requiring students to respond to briefs/commissions as well as generating their own proposals (both of which are vital preparation for professional work).
