Part 2: Description
<p>On this module you will critically examine the relationship between literature, law, responsibility and citizenship. The module builds on level 1 as it extends your critical awareness of how literature responds to and shapes global narratives and policies, and the ways in which literature and politics coalesce and collide. You will explore key themes which may include civil rights, gender equality, and sustainability. The module enhances your critical thinking, as well as your writing and presentation skills in preparation for the independent work you will undertake at level 3.</p> <p>There will be three hours of contact time per week that typically consists of lecture, workshop and seminar discussion. Lectures and workshops will typically provide visual support, i.e. PowerPoint, and seminars will typically take the form of student-led discussions and involve detailed close analysis.</p>
Part 3: Assessment

<p>The assessment both builds on level 1 and prepares you for the demands of level 3.</p> <p>Component A requires you to work as part of a team to create and deliver a group presentation. The marks for the group presentation will be allocated on an individual basis.</p> <p>The Extended Study prepares you for the demands of level 3 by requiring expansive research and an extended piece of writing that allows you to pursue your specific interests.</p>
