Part 2: Description

Educational Aims: See Learning Outcomes.

Outline Syllabus: This module will place the Cold War in its global context, moving away from the picture of a bipolar context between the Soviet Union and the United States, giving students a broader and more nuanced understanding of the post war world. We will look at the outbreak of the Cold War in Europe, the Chinese and Cuban Revolutions, the Korean, Vietnam and Afghan wars, the development of the nuclear age, decolonisation and national liberation struggles in Africa and Asia and the non-aligned movement. We will also look at the alternative models for development presented by the USA and the Soviet Union and aspects of transnational Cold War culture. The in depth study of this period will enrich students' historical understanding and also help students in module choice at Levels 2 and 3.

Teaching and Learning Methods: See Assessment.

Part 3: Assessment

Assessment will be in the form of an individual essay (1500 words) and a document analysis (1000 words). The essay allows students to develop and improve their skills of analysis and comprehension and encourages the ability to organise complex material into a coherent argument. The document analysis allows students to use digital archives to engage with primary sources and use their knowledge to sensitively contextualise and interpret information. All students will be given written and oral feedback.
