Part 2: Description
<p>This module covers the major developments in international relations, politics and society during the interwar period. We look at the formation and the actions of the League of Nations and other forms of transnationalism, the Russian Revolution and its challenge to the international order, the rise of authoritarian and fascist regimes across Europe and their contribution the two world wars, the failure of liberal democracy, the challenge to Western dominance from Japan and the role of the United States in a globalising world. We will also look at the development of mass popular cultures and lifestyles and artistic responses to this period of flux, development and crisis. The in depth study of this period will enrich their historical understanding and also help students in module choice at Levels 2 and 3.</p>
Part 3: Assessment
<p>Assessment will be in the form of an individual essay (1500 words) and a document analysis (1000 words). The essay allows students to develop and improve their skills of analysis and comprehension and encourages the ability to organise complex material into a coherent argument. The document analysis allows students to use digital archives to engage with primary sources and use their knowledge to sensitively contextualise and interpret information. All students will be given written and oral feedback.</p>
