## Part 2: Description

This module introduces students to a range of skills necessary for learning in higher education and within placement care settings. This is a requisite of a registered nurse and will enable students to develop and act professionally at all times using their knowledge and experience to make decisions in care delivery based on evidence. Registered nurses are required to reflect on their practice and keep abreast of an evolving healthcare environment. This module is designed to provide students with opportunities to explore a range of sources of evidence that develop awareness and key understanding of the concepts and principles used to inform both academic approaches to learning, digital capabilities and practice based decision making.

This module will use a range of learning and teaching strategies to support student learning and will include:

- Lectures
- Scenario based teaching through interaction
- Group work
- Self-directed learning
- Peer assisted learning
- Digital learning and Digital capabilities delivered through Blackboard and other virtual learning platforms

The indicative content of the module will focus on the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC) Future Nursing Standards (2018) with a particular focus on the NMC standards of proficiency platforms and annexes in exploring the nature of care and practice. Content will include:

Being an accountable professional

- Assessing needs and planning care
- Providing and evaluating care
- · Leading and managing nursing care and working in teams
- · Improving safety and quality of care
- Promoting health and preventing ill health
- Coordinating care

#### And two annexes:

- Communication and relationship management skills
- Nursing procedures

#### Part 3: Assessment: Strategy and Details

The use of a reflective assignment will allow students to develop and demonstrate their skills of critical thinking and writing, which will prepare them in developing academic writing skills and delivering care based on best available evidence. Students will explore a range of sources of evidence including searching and appraising the quality and usefulness of research and how these are used to inform both academic approaches to learning and practice based decisions.

**Formative assessment**: Students will have the opportunity to submit a 500 word document outlining a patient/carer information resource chosen indicating the evidence for choice including the minimum of three references.

### Summative assessment: A 3500 word assignment to include;

A patient/carer information resource (approximately 2000 words) plus a rationale, reflection and action plan relating to the resource (approximately 1500 words). The rationale, reflection and action plan should be based on a theoretical framework of choice; for example, Gibbs reflective cycle and supported by appropriate literature. Students are expected to provide a reference list at the end as per university guidelines.
