Part 2: Description

The confidence and ability to think critically, apply knowledge and skills, and provide expert, evidence-based, nursing care lies at the centre of nursing practice. This module is offers final year nursing students to consider long term career pathways prior to registration. Reflecting that enquiry and exploration are at the heart of the Future Nurse curriculum so that as nurses they will be able to influence and contribute to processes of organisational change through an awareness of local and national and international policies in healthcare delivery based on evidence. The module has a particular focus on the principles of delivering cardiac care including the psychological, psychosocial, cultural, gender and ethical issues from a local, national and international perspective.

This module will use a range of learning and teaching strategies to support student learning and will include:

- Lectures
- Scenario based teaching through interaction and simulation
- Group work
- Self-directed learning
- Digital learning delivered through Blackboard and other virtual learning platforms

Part 3: Assessment: Strategy and Details

The assessment strategy for this module is designed to allow a diverse range of students to be able to explore their own current and future practice focusing on an existing and or emerging model of care.

Formative assessment

Students will be given opportunities to test their understanding and learning within the online activities/ tests, through reflection on practice, group discussion forum and with feedback throughout the module.

Summative assessment

The student will be asked to write a 2000 word exploration of an aspect of cardiac nursing care. The students will have the opportunity to demonstrate and discuss appropriate evidence based treatment options in their clinical setting. The student will be able to demonstrate their knowledge base regarding assessment and management but also demonstrate within their writing evidence of critical analysis and synthesis of the evidence utilised
