## Part 2: Description

This module will introduce you to Primary Care working. It is aimed at those new to working in this environment, or those who are returning to Primary Care. The module covers four main areas:

#### **Professional Values**

- Working autonomously within own scope of practice
- Applying evidence based practice to support partnership working and shared decision making with patients and their families
- Awareness of learning and development needs, and support needs

## Communication and Interpersonal Skills

- Holistic assessment and care planning through shared decision making
- Equality and diversity: overcoming barriers to effective access to care and care delivery
- Public health and motivational interviewing

## **Primary Care Practice**

- Structure, function and values of primary care
- Introduction to managing complexity in long term conditions
- Patient safety and risk management
- Safeguarding and raising concerns (adults, children and families)

- Clinical skills for practice, for example, cervical screening; infection control; immunisations and vaccinations; sexual health; ear care and wound care - to be accessed through the Learning Hubs
- The importance of social prescribing and its role in primary care, for example, active signposting, selfcare and prevention of disease exacerbation
- Working in a multi- disciplinary team with an awareness of other health professional roles and their contribution to patient centred care

#### Leadership and Management

- Primary Care networks with the emphasis on the need for collaborative working across practices
- National Health and Social Care strategy and policy relating to Primary Care
- Clinical governance, regulation and service improvement

## Part 3: Assessment

Component A: 15 minute defended poster presentation demonstrating depth of knowledge and critical appraisal of primary care. 15 minutes of questions and discussion.

This assessment will provide an opportunity for the student to demonstrate knowledge and understanding in relation to clinical decision making in primary care and the particular challenges and opportunities with regard to patient services in the primary care context.

Formative assessment will take place through academic tutorial support and feedback.
