Part 2: Description

This module allows you to carry out in depth research in an area of FinTech of your own choosing. The exact nature of the assessment will be determined by your skills and interests; This could focus on a contemporary issue, challenge or problem in FinTech, or apply enterprise skills by developing and evaluating a new FinTech product or service. The project will require you to work with an academic supervisor and in some cases, where a live industry project is being pursued, an industry mentor. The project will build on your experience in the sister module Group Interdisciplinary Project and will incorporate a programme of specific research skills development workshops to support the project development.

You will cover:

- Research Methodology
- Literature review
- Data collection and analysis
- Research Ethics
- Research Project Management

Part 3: Assessment

The assessment will consist of a short proposal followed by the project report. This may take the form of a 10,000-word research dissertation, or an industry project report or enterprise development and evaluation equivalent to 10,000 words. The exact nature of the project will be determined by the student choices in consultation with the supervisor.

Element 1 – Proposal (1500 words) (15%)

The proposal will provide a project plan to support the viability and focus on the project, and set out the objectives of the chosen activity.
