# Part 2: Description

On completion of the module the student will be able to demonstrate and exercise the knowledge, behaviours and attitudes in providing compassionate, safe and effective care; and support to people across the lifespan. The focus will be the skills required for the nursing associate to monitor conditions and health needs of people within their care on a continual basis, and in partnership with families and carers. Ongoing assessment and recognition for further referral to other health professionals will be explored throughout the module.(NMC 2018)

The indicative content of the module will focus on the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC) standards (2018). Within each module in the programme, teaching and learning progressively explores the nature of care and practice, focusing on the NMC Standards of proficiency for nursing associate's platforms and annexes.

- Working in teams
- · Improving safety and quality of care
- · Contributing to integrated care

- Communication and relationship management skills
- Procedures to be undertaken by the nursing associate

The module will use a variety of teaching and learning methods:

Lectures, seminars, case scenarios, reflective approaches, presentations, directed and independent learning, elearning, patient narratives

# Part 3 Assessment

Ensuring students have the required knowledge and skills to undertake their role in providing and monitoring care is one of the platforms of the NMC standards.

Formative assessment: Students will be given the opportunity to complete a structured proforma that mirrors the summative assessment criteria in relation to their chosen case study. Proformas will be discussed within small peer groups under the supervision of a tutor. The peer group will ask for clarification of points that are not clear or have been omitted. As well as highlighting areas of good practice.

## Summative assessment:

A 3000 word case study enabling the student to draw on their practice experience and appropriate literature which reflects the person centred, patient/service user journey through an episode of ill health or recovery.

- Recognise and explain the behaviours and attitudes required in providing compassionate, safe and effective person-centred care and support to people in a range of care settings and in partnership with other healthcare professionals.
- 2. Demonstrate an understanding of knowledge and behaviours that the nursing associate requires in order to monitor conditions and health needs of people within their care on a continual basis and in partnership with families and carers.
- 3. Recognise and apply knowledge of commonly encountered mental, physical. behavioural and cognitive health conditions when delivering care.
- 4. Demonstrate and explain the fundamental principles of nursing practice and the nursing associate role within this and how these guides the assessment, planning, delivery and evaluation of care, and recognition of when to refer into other professionals

Demonstrate knowledge underpinning the provision, monitoring and application of holistic and effective care for people across the lifespan in the context of body systems, homeostasis, human anatomy and physiology, biology, genomics, pharmacology, social and behavioural science when delivering care.
- 6. Consider how concepts of the behavioural and cognitive health conditions, shared decision making, safety, dignity, privacy, documentation, co-morbidities, end of life care, pain management, capacity, and ethical and legal principles inform nursing practice.
