## Part 2: Description

The purpose of the module is to give students a sound understanding of how the criminal courts operate in the disposal of the cases brought before them.

The module covers the procedural aspects of criminal litigation, from the investigation of criminal offences and the commencement of proceedings, to the preliminary hearings in the magistrates' courts, the trial of criminal cases summarily and on indictment, and the various routes of appeal available to aggrieved parties.

In addition, it covers the procedural aspects of sentencing and the principal powers of the sentencing courts.

Finally, the module considers the rules and principles which govern the admissibility and the use of evidence in the criminal courts.

The subjects covered on the module are set out in detail in the syllabus provided from time to time by the Bar Standards Board.

The module is taught via seminars involving for example the discussion of pre-prepared questions and unseen exam-style questions; face-to-face and on line lectures and podcasts; and on line exam-style questions.

## Part 3: Assessment

The assessment of this module consists of one component – a 3-hour written examination comprising a combination of multiple choice and single best answer questions. The assessment is centrally set by the Bar Standards Board and is designed to test the outcomes in Part 4 below.

The summative assessment is preceded by two formative assessments: a 1-hour test halfway through the course comprising multiple choice and single best answer questions on the subjects so far covered on the course; and a 3-hour mock exam at the end of the course covering the whole syllabus.
