# Part 2: Description

This module will introduce you to the key principles which form the foundation for professional counselling practice. This will include the BACP Ethical Framework, management of counselling practice, client notes and record keeping within data protection policies, identifying ethical and legal responsibilities with regard to risk, acknowledging diversity and its impact on the therapeutic relationship and the process of therapy. Building upon these underpinnings, you will examine key relational theoretical approaches within counselling and psychotherapy and synthesise these into an integrated model for practice and way of understanding the development of psychological problems and distress. This will enable you to develop clear and coherent integrated case formulation.

This module will employ a variety of teaching methods including lectures, video illustrations, guided reading, experiential exercises in small groups and demonstrations.
