Part 2: Description

Educational Aims: This module is taught over the three terms of the first year. It is intended to equip you with resilient technique needed by a professional actor in different acoustics.

Outline Syllabus: This module will help you to develop strong support, good posture and efficient alignment, extending pitch and dynamic ranges. You will develop reliable singing voice production, breath control, breath management and voice placing. You will explore different styles of singing requiring different muscular setup and clear articulation. You will look at song lyrics in detail and see how you might best act through song. You will also look at the effects of nerves on the singing voice and how best to use them to your advantage. You will cover a wide range of styles of singing including early madrigals, folk song, legit songs and musical theatre from Rogers and Hammerstein to Sondheim.

You will explore the rudiments of music and apply them to the initial stages of learning a musical instrument.

Teaching and Learning Methods: Students will learn through group classes, individual tutorials, individual and group project work and master classes. You will be expected to practice your singing on a frequent basis outside of scheduled learning sessions.

Continuous formative feedback in class from tutors is an important part of your learning. Often verbal, it will be detailed, and designed to enable you to fulfil your potential in all areas.

Summative feedback will be provided at the end of the autumn, spring and summer terms in individual tutorials.

Part 3: Assessment

This is a Professional Practice Module and all assessments are Pass/Fail.

You will be assessed on the demonstration of basic competencies in singing skills, and techniques at three equally phased assessment points. You will also be assessed on the application and creative use of singing skills and technique in text projects, auditions and singing projects.
