Part 2: Description

Features: This module is an alternative core module to UPHNFL-15-2 for students who wish to do a film of their research project rather than a web-based project. Across the Level 2 core modules; UPHNFK-15-2 History in Practice and UPHNFL-15-2 Making History OR UPHNH4-15-2 Mediated Histories, students will have three points of contact with an external partner organization.

This module serves as preparation for the dissertation module at Level 3, and builds on research, professional and enterprise skills developed at Level 1.

Educational Aims: See Learning Outcomes.

Outline Syllabus: This module engages with the enterprise pathway within the core Level 2 module. It is a practice-based introduction to histories on film (documentary, fiction, cinema and television), with input from both university staff and external professionals working in, for example, archives, museums and heritage, education, and other public history contexts.

Teaching and Learning Methods: In addition to critical engagement with the theory informing the presentation of historical material on film, students will receive technical training in production.

Part 3: Assessment

The assessment for this module will be the production of a short film based on researched historical content, on a topic that the student has begun researching in the core level 2 module in semester 1, History in Practice. This will be accompanied by an individual written evaluation (1500 words) that contextualises and situates their film within the theoretical and cultural landscape and reflects on the practical skills developed over the course of the module.

Feedback for assessments will be sent first to students electronically. All students will be invited to attend personal feedback tutorials which will be a timetabled part of the module's contact hours.
