Part 2: Description		
<p>This optional module draws on the excellent range of digital resources available for the study of nineteenth and twentieth-century society and culture, including newspapers, pamphlets, statistics and digitised archives to explore poverty and urban society in Britain. It examines poverty and the urban experience at both the physical level and in the imagination, touching on themes of class, gender, 'race' and ethnicity, and sexuality.</p>		
Part 3: Assessment		
<p>Students will select a theme from the module to consider in detail, and assessment will comprise a 1,500 word document exercise, and a fifteen minute presentation with accompanying paper of 2,000 words. These assessments are designed to test a range of abilities from critical evaluation of primary material to the clear and concise communication of ideas, and will build upon skills gained at level 1 and further develop essential skills for the study of history at level 3.</p> <p>Feedback for these assessments will be sent first to students electronically. All students will be invited to attend personal feedback tutorials which will be a timetabled part of the module's contact hours.</p>
