Part 4: Assessment

Assessment strategy: Assessment for this module will be based on a studentdesigned project. This project can take any form (some examples being: a poster/ exhibition display, a blog, or a podcast), to be negotiated with the module leader, enabling students to present work that speaks to their chosen pathway; research, professional or enterprise. This project will be accompanied by a 1,500 word justification – essentially a critical reflection that contextualises and situates the project within a primary and secondary source base, allowing all students to demonstrate and develop core research skills.

Feedback for this assessment will be sent first to students electronically. All students will be invited to attend personal feedback tutorials which will be a timetabled part of the module's contact hours.
