Part 2: Description
<p>This core module is a practice-based introduction to research skills, methodological approaches, and ways of writing and presenting History. Students will examine the use of different approaches and arguments in shaping historical research, and most of the practical work will be focused on the delivery of an individually conceived, designed, researched and written independent project, which will be planned in UPHNFK-15-2 'History in Practice'. This project will be written up and presented as a web publication. Lectures and workshops will provide advice and guidance on how to organise and present, in written form, this research project. This will include training in open access software and web publication; consolidating and structuring analysis; persuasive writing; and best practice in academic writing. Workshops will provide opportunity for one-to-one discussion of research projects and advice on how to overcome the kinds of challenges which are routinely encountered in such investigations.</p> <p>This module, along with UPHNFK-15-2 'History in Practice' and UPHNH4-15-2 'Mediated Histories', serves as preparation for the dissertation module at Level 3 and builds on research and professional skills developed at Level 1.</p>
Part 3: Assessment
<p>Most of the practical work is focused on the delivery of an individually conceived, designed and researched independent project. This final project of 4,500 words will be written up and presented as a web publication. Students will be assessed on the quality of research, historiographical engagement, and written argument.</p>

Feedback for this assessment will be sent first to students electronically. All students will be invited to attend personal feedback tutorials which will be a timetabled part of the module's contact hours.
