UPHNFK-15-2 History in Practice and UPHNFL-15-2 Making History, students will have three points of contact with an external partner organization.

**Outline syllabus:** This core module is a practice-based introduction to research skills, methodological approaches, and ways of writing and presenting History, with input from both university staff and external professionals working in, for example, archives, museums and heritage, education, and other public history contexts. Most of the practical work will be focused on the delivery of an individually conceived, designed, researched and written independent project.

**Teaching and learning methods:** Lectures and workshops will provide advice and guidance on how to organise and present this research project. Workshops will provide opportunity for one-to-one discussion of research projects and advice on how to overcome the kinds of challenges which are routinely encountered in such investigations.
