# Part 2: Description

The use of evidence, research and enquiry is an integral part of professional health and social care practice. This module will prepare you to understand and critically evaluate evidence and will develop your knowledge of how to examine and improve practice through research and inquiry. This module will introduce you to contemporary research methodologies and methods related to your profession and its underpinning knowledge base. It will improve your confidence in relation to selecting appropriate research designs for different research questions; and help you to build your knowledge and skills towards undertaking your research project at level 6 within the module 'Research and Evidence in Practice'.

### This module will include:

- Principles and application of academic enquiry including what is evidence and critical reflection on what constitutes best evidence.
- · Research methodologies and other approaches,
- Ethical and governance issues
- Research process, research standards and tools.

This module will use a range of teaching and learning methods to support your learning. You will be expected to engage in directed and independent study using digital learning resources provided through Blackboard or other virtual learning platforms. Seminars and group work will be scheduled to provide opportunity to consolidate your learning. Your independent study time will be distributed between e-learning, preparation for seminars and group work and preparation for the assessment.

inquiry will inform and support your practice. You will need to be a critical user of evidence, aware of how to investigate and improve practice in line with ethical and governance standards. The assignment will develop your critical evaluation skills and enable you to use research to suggest innovative ways to address a question relevant to your profession.
